Primary School's Sports Funding

At St. Anne Line we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and wellbeing of the children. We believe that innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.

For the coming year, £1000 has again been used to give us access to James Hornsby Partnership. Through this we get free use of their pool, access to level 1, 2 and 3 competitions as well as gifted and talented sessions. They give us free qualified coaches throughout the year as well as advice and CPD. This also allows us to access competitions for those who don't find sport easy, and those with disabilities.

Some of the money pays the higher salary rate needed to employ qualified and experienced PE teachers, and keep their qualifications such as RLSS up to date. This ensures that quality lessons and clubs are delivered through the year.

Another chunk of money is used to ensure clubs can be open to all and that cover is available for staff to go to the wide variety of sporting activities available, as well as to attend training. This also ensures that when inter and intra school competitions are run, there are plenty of staff available with a good concentration of experienced staff. However, all equipment is purchased through the school budget, although the Change for Life equipment used by Gym Trail was given by the JHS.

The allocation of this funding has ensured that St Anne Line offers opportunities for all pupils regardless of interests and abilities; the breadth of our sport and teaching reflected in us gaining our Silver Kite Mark for sport.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments

for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil each year for the next two years - here at St. Anne Line Catholic Junior School that will mean around £9,000 a year. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses of the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- New or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport
