P.E and Sports Premium funding report: 2015 – 2016

What is Sports Premium funding?

The government has provided funding of £150 million (per annum) over the previous two academic years to provide high quality curricular and extra-curricular sporting provision. St. Anne Line RC Junior School has received £9000 per annum for each of the previous two school years, with this money being spent solely on sport and P.E. provision at the school; at the school, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of all of our pupils. We believe that an innovative and inclusive PE curriculum, complimented with a varied range of extra-curricular opportunities, has a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of our children.

St. Anne Line RC Junior School: 2015-16

This academic year, our *P.E and Sport Premium* funding has enabled us to extend our provision through employing additional sports professionals - Change 4 Life has been run to educate and support identified pupils with changes towards having a healthy lifestyle, and to encourage them participate in more intra and inter-school competitive sports events. As in previous years, the school again has invested monies to affiliate ourselves the *James Hornsby Partnership*. Through this, the school is able to provide swimming lessons for our Year 5 cohort, gain access to level 1, 2 and 3 competitions, and enabled our *Gifted and Talented* pupils to attend sessions. Another benefit of this partnership was that it enabled access to competitions for Disadvantaged pupils; these included entry to inter-school tennis and 'Kurling' competitions, the latter of which saw our school emerge as district champions. The partnership has also enabled the school to employ qualified coaches, who have planned and taught high-quality P.E. throughout the year, and it is used for our pupils, identified with a disability or SEN need, to access competitions.

P.E and Sport Premium funding was also used to ensure that extra-curricular clubs were open to all pupils, and that - when children attended inter-school competitions – cover was provided so that staff could supervise these events. The main impact of the allocation of this *P.E and Sport Premium* funding has ensured that St. Anne Line RC Junior School offers opportunities for high quality P.E. for all our pupils regardless of interests and abilities; this commitment was reflected in the school previously being able to gain the *Sainsbury's Schools Games Silver Mark* award for sport, an award that recognises and rewards schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school and into the community.
